Concept

This display aims to create a serene and aesthetically pleasing garden that is both functional and enjoyable—an architectural space that maintains a strong connection to nature.

The garden is centered around a contemporary pavilion, nestled within a lush, verdant planting scheme. It is a harmonious blend of green foliage and structural form. The seating area is sheltered under a roof canopy and situated on a central terrace, which, through the use of mirrors, creates the illusion of floating above the garden. The roof and tall walls are adorned with abundant plant life. The ambience is enriched by the sound of flowing water, while a wall-mounted sunburst sculpture adds depth and intrigue to the backdrop.

The planting selection is deliberately restrained, featuring predominantly green foliage. The materials palette is minimalist, incorporating polished concrete, emerald tiles and steel details. Effective rainwater management is achieved through a connection between the roof and pool. The artful use of lighting plays a key role in creating atmosphere and depth, transforming a compact space into a sanctuary for rest and contemplation.

Inside the garden, ancient legends seamlessly merge with a vibrant mix of flora, creating a sense of timelessness that connects the past to the present. The majestic indigenous tree of Xishuangbanna, reminiscent of the celestial tree depicted in "Shan Hai Jing", and the giant vines stretching hundreds of metres, have been incorporated to highlight the abundant biodiversity of the tropical rainforest, while advocating for the vital importance of species conservation. 

B01 - SLICE OF THE FOREST

Tropical plants from different parts of the world bring the peaceful beauty of the outdoors inside, providing users with an immersive natural retreat. This design celebrates Singapore's diverse biodiversity by showcasing a range of native plants from different forest layers.

The canopy layer includes tropical epiphytes, while the understory layer features lush ferns, orchids and shrubs. Ground cover plants and mosses represent the forest floor, creating a multi-dimensional, layered effect. Strategically positioned planters, vertical gardens and water elements enhance this forest environment. Rustic elements such as wooden furniture, stone wall and a small water feature add to the tranquil ambience, promoting relaxation and a profound connection to nature indoors

B02 - REJUVENATED ROOTS: REDISCOVERING BOTANICAL BOUNTY

BO3 - RURAL REVIVAL

Concept

This garden intertwines the past and present to create a seamless fusion of vintage charm and modern functionality.

The incorporation of pea sprouts cascading onto a repurposed Mahogany wood table, crafted from a fallen tree, introduces both greenery and functionality. Repurposing a disused wine barrel as planter adds a rustic allure, while the herbs and spices offer both aromatic appeal and fresh ingredients for cooking. The pairing of ornamental plants with weathered truck deck wood establishes a visually captivating space where its history of heavy use adds character, while the greenery brings tranquillity. The use of full-spectrum grow lights ensures optimal plant growth in an urban setting.

Meanwhile, nostalgic elements such as hanging bullock cart wheels and antique weighing scales are complemented by the unexpected twist of the organic mushroom wall. The juxtaposition of old and new, rustic and modern, creates a dynamic and welcoming space that celebrates sustainability and creativity, demonstrating how discarded items can find new purpose in a contemporary setting.

This display is an exploration of the relationship between the whole and its parts.

It draws inspiration from Jackson Pollock's abstract expressionism, and delves into Gestalt theory to examine how the dynamics shift when the scale of each part is increased. Gestalt theory, originating in psychology in the early 20th century, emphasises the importance of considering the whole entity or configuration rather than just its individual parts. It suggests that our perception organises sensory information into meaningful patterns or wholes, rather than simply perceiving isolated elements.

TO4 - "KOPI TOH": THE COFFEE CONNECTION

"KOPI" is Malay for coffee, and "TOH" refers to table in the Hokkien dialect. *Kopi Toh* delves into how our coffee culture enriches our perception of life and our relationships with people.

Here, we design a playful dining experience that rekindles a fresh connection with our heritage. Taking the cue from retro floor tiles and vintage metal shutters, *Kopi Toh* recreates a cozy and bold dining space with a modern Nanyang vibe.

An abundance of red botanicals, accented with pops of cobalt blue and glossy green, is naturally interwoven within the contemporary geometrical structure of *Kopi Toh*, creating a funky gardenscape that incorporates local coffee culture into our present dining space.

Come sip some black coffee and pandan-flavoured cocktails in the beauty and tranquility of our Nanyang-inspired setting.

Look out for Smooth-coated Otters cooling off in the slow-flowing streams meandering between the majestic forest trees and palms in the serene Freshwater Swamp Forest.

At the heart of these forest habitats, the front yard of a tropical treehouse features lush ornamental plants and edibles. The elements of natural forest habitats and community gardens are intertwined in the display to symbolise the fostering of a harmonious relationship between the nature and community.

G02 - SINGAPORE GARDENING SOCIETY

The Singapore Gardening Society and National Parks Board welcome visitors to step into the Hall of Fame. Over the last nine decades, the Singapore Botanic Gardens and local breeders have produced many fine and significant orchid hybrids, some of which have helped to put Singapore on the world map. Nestled amidst a verdant backdrop, this display showcases some of Singapore's most significant heritage orchids. These include orchids associated with the Gardens and Singapore Gardening Society. Keep a lookout for the interpretive signs that will help in spotting the key orchid hybrids on the lush columns, as well as the wide array of epiphytes adorning the garden arches!

G03 - BUKIT BULU

By This Humid House Pte. Ltd.

Bukit Bulu playfully evokes a topography of low hills on a table using tropical ingredients with furry textures. Inspired by the warm, earthen colours of Luzerne's WoodFire collection, we designed a low, decagonal table at coffee table height, paired with batik-upholstered legless chair backs, to sit diners low as is the tradition in many Asian cultures. This setting showcases a sprawling, fecund display of tropical flora in shiny brass vessels, deliberately kept low to maintain sightlines between diners. The gestural composition of the tabletop arrangement engages in vivid conversation with the playful batik print. Eschewing greens entirely, the fiery red and orange hues of Heliconia vellerigera and Marigold blaze through a thicket of dried palm inflorescence, glowing brightly in the absence of foliage.

G04 - CELESTIAL GARDEN

Blossoms sway gently in a cosmic dream. Constellations twinkle, casting a spell, A celestial oasis where wonders dwell.

Petals like stardust, in hues so divine, In this ethereal realm, nature intertwines. Where galaxies bloom and constellations entwine, Celestial garden, a dreamer's shrine.

A highlight of the exhibition is a talk titled "Pots for Bonsai" on 10 August (Saturday) from 1-2 pm. We invite you to join us at this event to gain a deeper appreciation for the intricacies of bonsai.

The Playground Zone:


